Dr. Chris Skaggs, San Antonio Livestock Exposition Endowed Chair and professor in Animal Science, said this experience gives the students a behind-the-scenes indoctrination into show management as well as an appreciation for what it takes to organize a show of this magnitude.

"The students have all shown before so they understand what happens from that perspective. This opportunity provides them an intense, hands-on engagement with what it takes to manage one of the largest livestock shows in the country. They learn how to deal with people and situations which enhances their communication skills."

To qualify as an intern, students must have previous show experience in San Antonio, have a solid work ethic, the ability to follow directions and work with show man-

agement, and be professional and friendly in dealing with exhibitors, parents and adult leaders.
