

Texas A&M team wins People's Choice Award in cookoff

LAS VEGAS – A team from the Rosenthal Meat Science Center competed in the Student Cook-off held during the National Meat Association's 65th Annual Convention in Las Vegas Feb. 13-16 and won the People's Choice Award for their stuffed pork loin. The student team of Carter Sells from Bandera and Tyler Kusak from Yoakum, both student workers at the Rosenthal Center, was advised by Ray Riley, center manager. They entered

a pork tenderloin stuffed with jalapeno and cheese sausage seasoned with raspberry chipotle sauce, all products from the Rosenthal Center. Eight universities participated in the cook-off. Two awards were given, one chosen by a panel of expert judges and the other by the vote of the attendees. 
