Wool Judging Team wins first, second places at HLSR

HOUSTON – The Texas A&M University Wool Judging Team brought home both first and second place awards from the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Intercollegiate Wool Judging Contest on March 15, 2011, closing out the spring judging competition season.

Angelo State University Blue, Kansas State University and Angelo State University Gold finished third, fourth and fifth.

Aggie team members secured six out of the top ten high individual awards led by Katie Moore from Richmond winning high individual. This was followed by Konni Kelso from Seguin; Dillon Garr from Fayetteville, Ark.; Jacob Brown from Bryan; Lea Luensmann from Zuehl; and Brent Hale from Dayton finishing second, third, fourth, seventh and tenth high overall individually. Also representing Texas A&M were Brittni Littlejohn from Longview; William Whitworth from Junction; Meredith Earwood from Sonora; Chloe Geye from Rising Star; Lexus Weinheimer from Stonewall; Whitley James from George West; and Misty Jackson from Sumner.

Dr. Shawn Ramsey is the faculty coach/coordinator and Kim Hardan is the coach. Assistant coaches are Claire Luensmann, Kenton Kirkpatrick and Carl Muntean.

The Intercollegiate Wool Judging Contest involves placing breed and commercial fleeces and classifying 15 fleeces of wool into various grades and spinning counts. Special attention is paid to the wool's staple length and yield, and the highest yielding fleeces are ranked first, followed in order by those with a lesser yield. Additionally, contestants determine the correct grades for a class of 20 mohair samples. The contest awards prizes in both individual and team categories.

HOUSTON - The Texas A&M University Livestock Judging Team closed out the spring competition season with a second place finish at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Intercollegiate Livestock Judging Contest on March 15, 2011.

Texas Tech University took first place, followed by Western Illinois University, Purdue University and Iowa State University in third, fourth and fifth, respectively.

In team competition, Texas

A&M won first place in sheep and goats; second in reasons and cattle; and third place in swine. Individually, Caleb Boardman from Powell, Wyo., finished third high individual.

The Intercollegiate Livestock Judging Contest requires six-member teams, with five members' scores counting toward team awards. Contestants judge four animals in separate cattle, swine, lamb and goat classes. The animals are evaluated on conformation and appearance. The contestants turn in scorecards as well as present an oral set of reasons for choosing the class animals in the order they did. Formal judges' scores are compared to the contestants', and point values are given or deducted depending on how similar the contestant scored the breed class.

Aggie REPS recruit at livestock show


