2015 BCSC Participant Reminders

- 1. Please return the registration form by July 30, 2015. Remember online registration is available at beefcattleshortcourse.com. There is a \$40 late fee after July 30th.
- **2.** PARKING: TAMU Parking and Transit Services has allocated a parking lot (Lot 61) for BCSC participant use on the west side of Welborn Rd. Lot 61 is a short walk to MSC/Rudder Complex or there is a free shuttle bus that runs to and from MSC/Rudder Complex. A flat event rate of \$15 has been negotiated for this parking lot. Parking passes need to be kept on the front windshield of the vehicle and can be purchased onlline at http://transport.tamu.edu/Account/Conference/parkingpermits.aspx or onsite for \$20. This also covers parking at campus based BCSC sessions on Wednesday at MSC (Lot 61), Rosenthal (Lot 74) and Pearce Pavilion (Lot 63). Parking is also available at Koldus (University Center Garage, 6 ft., 9in. clearance), located directly across from Rudder Complex where the BCSC is held, for a maximum of \$15 per day. There is no pre-pay option for the parking garage. Parking in lots other than those listed above may result in fines.

- **4.** Pick up the final program and proceedings as soon as you arrive. The final program will be on the website and emailed in late July to help you decide which sessions to attend. One will also be provided at your arrival to BCSC with exact topics, times, locations and speakers. You may pick up your registration packet on Sunday afternoon or Monday morning.
- **5.** Hot coffee, juice and breakfast will be provided as you arrive early Monday morning. Trade show opens at 6:30 a.m. and a general assembly begins at 8 a.m. for the program orientation and instructions. Monday's concurrent sessions begin at 8:30 a.m. and continue until noon when lunch will be served. The General Session will begin after lunch. The famous Texas Aggie Prime Rib Dinner will be served Monday evening at 6 p.m. in the Texas A&M MSC, following the general session.
- **6.** The BCSC continues on Tuesday with breakfast followed by the Cattleman's College at 8:30 a.m. Lunch will be served at noon, followed by another round of sessions Tuesday afternoon concluding at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday evening is left open for the industry to schedule meetings, receptions and activites.
