#### **Texas and Southwest Cattle Raisers Youth Contests**

Fort Worth, Texas – Young cattle raisers can showcase their creative talents by entering up to four youth contests during the Cattle Raisers Convention, April 4-6 in San Antonio. Deadline for all entries is March 3.

Youth ages five to 17 can enter the photography, art and essay contests. Youth ages 13 to 17 are eligible to enter the beef promotion video contest, the newest contest added to the lineup. Each contest is specifically designed to allow young cattle raisers to showcase how ranching life has positively affected their family.

The contests are sponsored by Farm Credit. A total of \$5,000 in cash prizes will be awarded to winners. Entries will be judged and winners selected at the Cattle Raisers Convention.

All contestants must be a member of TSCRA, either a student member, child or grandchild of a member, or a child of parents who are employed by a TSCRA member. Non-members can become members prior to the contest by contacting TSCRA at 817-332-7064. There is a membership fee of \$25 for young members.






#### **Photography Contest**

#### **Youth Preparedness Council**

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is seeking applicants for its Youth Preparedness Council.

The Youth Preparedness Council is a unique opportunity for youth leaders to serve on a highly distinguished national council and participate in the Youth Preparedness Council Summit. Additionally, the youth leaders have the opportunity to complete a self-selected youth preparedness project and to share their opinions, experiences, ideas, solutions and questions regarding youth disaster preparedness with the leadership of FEMA and national youth preparedness organizations. Once selected, members serve on the Council for one year, with the option to extend for an additional year, if formally requested by FEMA.

Council activities and projects center around five key areas of engagement: Programs, Partnerships, Events, Public Speaking/Outreach and Publishing. Members represent the youth perspective on emergency preparedness and share information with their communities. They also meet with FEMA on a regular basis to provide ongoing input on strategies, initiatives and projects throughout the duration of their term.

Any individual between the ages of 12 and 17 who is engaged in individual and community preparedness or who has experienced a disaster that has motivated him or her to make a positive difference in his or her community, may apply to serve on the Youth Preparedness Council. Individuals who applied last year are highly encouraged to apply again. Adults working with youth and/or community preparedness are encouraged to share the application with youth who might be interested in applying.

Youth interested in applying to the Council must submit a completed application form and two letters of recommendation. Specific information about completing and submitting the application and attachments can be found in the application instructions. All applications and supporting materials must be received no later than <u>February 24, 2014</u>, 11:59 p.m. EST in order to be eligible. New Youth Preparedness Council members will be announced in May 2014.

#### **Congratulations Consumer Team!!!**

Bell County 4-H members participated in the consumer decision making project this year and participated at the Western Nationals Roundup January 8-12, 2014. Peter Fasolino, Nathaniel Fasolino, Brandon Stone, and Brittany Stone competing at the district contest in March 2013 where they placed 1st out of 11 teams. The team then competed at the Texas 4-H Roundup state competition on June 2013 in College Station where they placed 1st place team out of 28 teams and Peter won won 6th high individual and Nathaniel won 7th high individual out of 108 competitors.

The first place team at Texas 4-H Roundup qualifies for Western National Roundup in Denver, Colorado which occurs in January. The team competed against 11 teams and approximately 41 participants at the national level. The team placed 2nd as a team overall and Brandon Stone placed 2nd as an individual overall. The team is also placed in each part of the contest at the national level. The Bell County 4-H team placed 4th in placings and Brandon placed 5th individually. In reasons, the team placed 1st place and Peter placed 1st, Brittany 2nd, and Brandon 4th individually, and the team placed 2nd in group think which was a new part of the contest for the team.



#### **Texas 4-H Congress:**

Texas 4-H Congress is the premiere citizenship and leadership experience for Texas 4-H members between the ages of 15 and 18. Held on the even numbers years in the Texas State Capitol, Texas 4-H Congress allows 4-H members to experience the law making process first hand by writing, submitting, and then serving as a member of the House of Representatives, the Senate, the Press, or as a Lobbyist. From these roles, the 4-H members determine the fate of each bill submitted over the four day event.

### How Can a 4-H Member Participate in Texas 4-H Congress

#### WHAT IS TEXAS 4-H CONGRESS?

Texas 4-H Congress is a premiere citizenship and leadership event for the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program. It allows 4-H members from across Texas to experience the legislative process. Below are the different ways that 4-H members can participate both in the civic engagement and learning process to actually participating in Texas 4-H Congress.

#### **TEXAS 4-H COUNCIL MEMBER**

Texas 4-H Council Members assist in the planning and implementation of Texas 4-H Congress. During Texas 4-H Congress, council members serve in the roles of Governor, Lt. Governor, Speaker of the House, and other leadership roles. In addition to the roles in the Executive Branch, council members serve as committee chairman and have the responsibility to explaining the legislative process to the delegates so they can fully participate.

#### 4-H YOUTH OF ANY AGE

Regardless of age, any 4-H member, as an individual or a group, can research a issue affecting the state of Texas and write a legislative bill that helps resolve or eliminates the problems. The legislative bill writing process involves researching the issue, determining the best solution for the process, identifying if any current legislation is enforce, and if not what is the cost of the legislation and who is responsible for the possible law.

#### HOUSE OR SENATE MEMBER

These roles are primarily for 4-H members that have never participated in Texas 4-H Congress. Four-H members serving in the House or Senate should be prepared and able to speak passionately about issues effecting Texas and Texas Youth. The issues that the 4-H member will be speaking about may or may not be related to the subject matter of the bill they submitted. House and Senate members will be participating in a variety of professional settings such as committee meetings, chamber sessions, and may be lobbied or questioned on different issues by the Lobbyist group and/or the Press Corps. Assignments to the House and Senate are made by the State 4-H Office.

#### LOBBYIST

The Lobbyist group is designed for 4-H members who have attended Texas 4-H Congress in the past. The responsibility of the Lobbyist group is to identify certain bills and then lobby members of the House and Senate to either pass or defeat the bill. Lobbyist should be knowledgeable about Texas 4-H Congress and the schedule that it follows. Lobbyist members should be prepared to and have the ability to approach other 4-H members and persuade House and Senate members for support. The Lobbyist group will hold a "by invitation only" reception for House and Senate Members, along with Congress Leadership.

#### PRESS CORPS

The Texas 4-H Congress Press Corps play an extremely important part in the success of the event. Press Corps members can be either first time or returning 4-H members to 4-H Congress. Individuals applying for Press Corps should have strong skills in writing, word processing, interviewing, photography, and focused on making deadlines. The press corps is responsible for the publishing of a daily newspaper and helping maintaining a web page/electronic communication. Press Corps members should be aware that sometimes they may not be able to attend certain events because of print deadlines.

#### TECHNOLOGY TEAM 4-H MEMBERS

Up to four (4) members from the Texas 4-H Technology Team will be selected by the group's adult leadership to participate in Texas 4-H Congress. Technology Team members assist the Texas 4-H Congress Management Team in webpage updates, videotaping, streaming video, podcasting, and other technology based tasks.


