Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship Applications Available On-Line

The 2013 Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship application for all 4-H seniors are now available on the Texas 4-H website. The Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship Program offers four different types of scholarship for either high school seniors or former 4-H members. Scholarships available are:

- Baccalaureate scholarships for those high school seniors entering college/university to acquire a four year degree.
- Technical scholarship for youth not wanting a four year degree, but a technical training certificate through a junior college or a accredited trade school.
- Courageous Heart scholarship for 4-H members who have experienced major obstacles that have altered their lifestyles related to home, school, or medical but have remained active in 4-H and in their school accomplishments.
- Collegiate Scholarship for former 4-H members that have been in college for at least one year and have completed at least 30 hours of college course work. Other requirements related to GPA are also required to apply.

The scholarship applications as well as instructions and examples are provided on the Texas 4-H and Youth Development website. Please make sure that you download and review all pieces of information prior to completing the application.

Each county will determine their own county deadline for the application to be submitted. Interviews for the scholarships will be held on May 10-12, 2013 in Austin, Texas. Awarding will take place on Monday, June 10, 2013 at Texas 4-H Roundup in College Station. To be considered and awarded any of the Texas 4-H Opportunity scholarships an applicant must participate in all aspects of the program.

Does your 4-H club or group need financial support with a special project or initiative? If so, the Texas 4-H Friends and Alumni Association and the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation encourage you to explore te Texas 4-H Program Support Grant Program. These \$500 grants are due by December 15th to the Texas 4-H Foundation Office via e-mail or fax. Twelve grants will be awarded in January and the funds must be used within the year, so you will have time to implement your project/initiative. Grants funds can be used in the following areas:

- Strengthening clubs Utilizing the knowledge of the human growth and development process to create environments that help youth reach their full potential. This will be done through the development of youth and adult leadership programs, focusing on both young youth as well as high school age youth and the development packaged programs (ie PULSE, WAT, Yea 4-H, Wildlife & Fisheries, Environmental Education, etc).
- Expanding Outreach efforts Provide an introduction to the 4-H program through activities that reflect current youth trends and interest. Programs that provide opportunities for youth to be involved in special interest groups and provide outreach programs within the school systems targeted at specific grade levels.
- Marketing and Technology Utilize technology to reach new audiences and market the 4-H program within your community to attract a wide diverse audience. Providing opportunities for members to be interactive through technology such as GPS and other multimedia activities.
- Projects and Opportunities Development of support materials and learning opportunities targeted to project areas of interest to youth.
- Engaging Volunteers Volunteer training opportunities and orientation programs which engage volunteers. Development of short-term volunteer opportunities along with long-term. Increased training and resources to help volunteers understand their roles and responsibilities.
- Program Development Planning, implementing and evaluating programs that achieve youth development outcomes. Facilitating the program development process through county 4-H programs.

4-H Archery Camp-Registration Closes December 16, 2012

Texas 4-H Archery Camp will be held at the Texas 4-H Center in Brownwood on January 18-20, 2013. This camp is open to 4-H members age 9 to 18 wanting to improve their shooting knowledge and skills in recurve and compound archery, and certified 4-H archery coaches desiring to learn more about coaching archery, archery equipment, archery games, and improved shooting skills. Youth participants should have beginning or intermediate experience in shooting archery and understand the basic archery safety and range rules, and whistle commands. Adult and youth participants must provide their own equipment. Registration on 4-H Connect will be open November 12-December 16, 2012. Registration is limited to the first 30 youth registrants and the first 10 adult coaches and will be \$150 per participant.

Hunting & Wildlife Leader Training

One design of this training is to prepare an Adult Volunteer Leader to coach youth in the Hunting & Wildlife Shooting Sports discipline and certify Adult Volunteer Leaders as coaches to regularly instruct their local youth and coach them in Hunting & Wildlife events sponsored by 4-H. The training is also designed for any Adult Volunteer Leader wishing to work with their local youth in a hunting or wildlife project or a combination of the two outside of Shooting Sports. Training will be held February 2-3, 2013 in College Station, TX. Registration for this event will be open December 1-30, 2012 on 4-H Connect and will be \$50 per participant, No Charge for Extension Employees. Wildlife & Fisheries Curriculum Enrichment Programs Celebrate 20 Years!

Covering 20 years—(beginning with the 1992-93 school year and ending with the 2011-12 school year), that is the number of third, fourth and fifth graders that have directly participated in our four curriculum enrichment modules: The White-tailed Deer (debuted in 1992), Wildlife Success Stories and Endangered Species (1993), Something's Fishy (1995) and City Critters (2003). The modules reached many additional students beyond the ones actually participating in grade -specific lessons that consist of free-standing displays, videos, lesson plans and interactive cds-all made available to public, private and home school students via their respective Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service county Extension agents. Additional module uses have included field days, agricultural and natural resources tours and county fairs.

The great thing about curriculum enrichment in schools is that student participants often mirror the demographics of the community as a whole. Demographically, the student sample of 93,354 was comprised of 51% males and 49% females. Ethnicity of students consisted of whites (54%), blacks (17%), Hispanics (27%), Asian (1%) and all others (1%).

Student participation by module type was as follows: The White-tailed Deer (3rd grade) n=16,581, Wildlife Success Stories and Endangered Species (3rd grade) n=39,523, Something's Fishy (4th grade) n=31,195 and City Critters (5th grade) n=6,055. Students participating in all modules significantly increased their knowledge (based on pre-/post-test scores) of wildlife, aquatic ecology and natural resources conservation. By module, student gains in knowledge averaged: The White-tailed Deer-72% , Wildlife Success Stories and Endangered Species-43%, Something's Fishy-45% and City Critters-26%.

Over the past 13 school years, economic value was also assigned to module use/access by participating teachers based on a willingness-to-pay model. The total economic value during this time period was calculated to be \$766,245 and averaged \$58,942 annually for the 13 year period.

This curriculum enrichment effort has also enjoyed a "multiplier effect". Over 35 duplicates of these modules are currently in use. Although most modules are Texas-based, another dozen states have adopted them as well.

TEEN RETREAT

4-H members, ages 13-19, will have an opportunity to hone their skills in several 4-H programming areas during the Teen Leadership Retreat set for January 4-6 at the Texas 4-H Conference Center on Lake Brownwood.

The Teen Leadership Retreat features 4-H Volunteers, 4-H Specialists and college professors conducting hands-on educational workshops with 4-H members. This year's program will focus on increasing knowledge and skills in five areas; robotics, fitness challenge, dancing, bubbles in food and a veteran's service project.

The retreat starts with registration at 7 p.m. January 6th, followed by general orientation at 9 p.m. and adult chaperone orientation at 9:30 p.m.

The January 5th activities start at 7:30 a.m., followed by a flag ceremony and breakfast, with the first of the day's three general assemblies beginning at 9 a.m. The remainder of the day will be devoted to concurrent sessions featuring the five programming areas. The last event of the day will include a traditional 4-H dance.

While this is learning retreat, the main ingredient for the whole weekend is a sense of fun. Dr. Lance Kieth from West Texas A&M will host a leadership session and Dr. Leslie Thompson from Texas Tech University will be here to teach the bubbles in food program.

Each county sending 4-H youth to the retreat must provide adult chaperones for the weekend. Individual registration is \$105 for youth and \$70 for adult chaperones. 
