Recently my parents were lamenting over the fact that their children were growing up. They couldn't believe their first born would soon be entering college. After a moment of silent bliss, my father began to stammer, "Do you realize we will soon have three children in college at the same time?"

I am the oldest of five children and come from a family committed to the concept of providing their children with quality education. I have always desired to follow the example of my parents, by attending college to earn a degree. At an early age I was infatuated with the idea of becoming a pilot. Then in my teen years I began to feel the Lord God calling me to serve Him full time as a missionary pilot. Today, my aspiration is to major in missionary aviation with the goal of joining a mission board and serving people in remote areas. This will require me to obtain a dual degree in aeronautical science and aircraft maintenance, a demanding program requiring four to five years of intense study. In reviewing flight degrees from many programs, I quickly discovered flight training is extremely expensive adding approximately \$10,000 per year to the cost of regular course work. I am concerned about placing this burden on my parents or going into debt, thus preventing me from joining a mission organization upon graduating.

My parents strongly value education and have agreed to assist me in paying for college. However, because I have four younger siblings in grades 10th, 9th, 5th, and 4th who also will be seeking higher education, I feel it is very important for me to assist my family by paying for the majority of my tuition, so my siblings can have the same opportunities I have enjoyed. In an effort to accomplish this in 2006, I began my own lawn business and have worked diligently grooming twelve to sixteen residential lawns a week saving my earnings for an automobile, insurance, and college. To date, I have been able to invest approximately \$6,000 in stock mutual funds with the thoughts of using this for my tuition, but with the current economic crisis my fund balance has decreased by thirty - forty percent. To help defray the high cost of attending a university, I began dual credit classes at Temple College and Central Texas College and have completed 38 of the required 146 credits to achieve my flight majors, reducing the overall cost by approximately eighteen percent and enabling me to finish the dual degree in four years. This year I began applying for scholarships in hopes of receiving awards to help with my tuition, flight time, fees and supplies, thus enabling me to provide even more assistance to my parents.

I have chosen to attend LeTourneau University, a private school located in Longview, Texas, feeling they can provide me with (the best combined education) an excellent education in both aeronautical science and aviation mechanics. In choosing this institution I considered the reputation of LeTourneau's aeronautical graduates and learned the majority of their students are sought after by mission boards and commercial airlines. I took a look at the content of the courses, their training equipment, the faculty's credentials, and decided it would be a perfect match for me. Each year I spend as a full time student at LeTourneau will cost me approximately \$32,000 for tuition, required flight time, room, board, and fees. My plans for a degree in missionary aviation will require four to five years of rigorous study including two summer internships leaving me little time during the year to earn a significant contribution to my tuition. The limited number of hours I will be able to work during school and summers will likely provide me with only enough money to use for living expenses such as car insurance and repairs, gasoline, and clothing.

I am willing and expecting to work diligently as I attend college; however, scholarships such as the Texas 4-H & Youth Development Opportunity Scholarship will enable my younger sister and brothers to have the same opportunities I was given, and enable me to afford one of the best educations I can obtain in aeronautical science and aviation maintenance while assisting me with my tuition requirements. This will allow me to spend more hours studying and less time away from my books earning the funds needed to stay in school and graduate debt free.
