



Attend the Homeowner Maintenance of Septic Systems Course for Free!

This course provides a basic understanding of the operational and maintenance activities for a conventional septic system and explains how activities within the home impact septic systems. Presentations will cover the treatment processes, health and safety considerations, inspecting the treatment system, care and feeding of the system, and maintenance procedures. Participants will leave this class with a better understanding of practices required to keep their system working.

Audience

Homeowners interested in gaining knowledge about the operation and maintenance of their onsite wastewater treatment systems.

Before You Attend

If possible, please know the following information about your system: Type of system; dispersal method; size of septic tank, drainfield, and lot; age of components; number of occupants in the home; known problems or issues with the system; date since last pump-out or inspection.

Incentive

Eligible participants may receive a **free septic tank pump-out** and system inspection.

This is made possible by funding through the Clean Water Act Section 319(h) dollars provided through the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). TCEQ has provided Texas A&M AgriLife Research the funds to conduct reconnaissance, public outreach, inspect onsite sewage facilities (OSSFs), and if needed pump primary septic tanks.
