
Major Shows will be starting in January with Fort Worth. If you entered for Fort Worth, please come by the 4-H office and see Rachel for your passes.

Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship

Texas 4-H awards 225 scholarships for students – all you need is 4-H experience, financial need, and your academic record. The scholarship awards range from \$1,000-\$20,000.

There is a scholarship category for most everyone, including:

- Baccalaureate Scholarship: For students interested in a four-year degree.
- Technical Certification: For students interested in joining the workforce soon after finishing high school. Some 4-H approved examples are vocational nursing, veterinary technology, and electrical design technology. More 4-H approved vocational programs are listed on page 5 of the Opportunity Scholarship Application and Guideline page.
- Courageous Heart: For students who continued school and 4-H during hardship.
- Collegiate Scholarships: For former 4-H students currently attending a college or university. You will need at least 30 hours of college credit and a GPA of 2.7 to apply.

For the first three scholarship types, you will follow the same application instructions and process. When you submit your application, 4-H will determine all of the scholarships that you are eligible for. The collegiate scholarship has its own application. See below.

How to get started:

- 1. Review the application and submission guidelines for baccalaureate, technical, and courageous heart. The guidelines will list the requirements for each scholarship type, such as GPA and SAT scores.
- 2. Review samples of example applications.
- 3. Choose the type of scholarship you want to apply for baccalaureate, technical, or courageous heart. You will note your scholarship type at the top of your application.
- 4. Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) application and submit the student aid report with your 4-H scholarship application. We have prepared a
- 5. Download and complete an application.
- 6. Submit your completed application and FAFSA student aid report to our local county office.




