

The Master Wellness Volunteer initiative is a Texas AgriLife Extension Service program that will provide volunteers with 40 hours of training in health and nutrition education. The training will focus on physical activity, nutrition, food safety, food demonstrations, child health, and various Extension nutrition, health and wellness programs.


Who Volunteers? 4-H Adult Volunteers, High School Students (age 16 or above), Health and Wellness Coordinators, Workplace and Church Volunteers, Human Resource Managers, Organizational and Civic Leaders. As well as, anyone who is interested in promoting Health and Wellness in their community.

Master Wellness Volunteer Classes will be held on January 14, 21, 28, and February 4 &18, 2010. All of the training will be at the Bell County Extension Office. After becoming certified, volunteers agree to give back 40 hours of service. The volunteer opportunities are diverse - giving presentations for local community groups, assisting with periodic cooking schools, passing out information at health fairs, and much more. Previous health or wellness training is not required, but an interest in living healthfully and helping others do the same is. Beef Cattle Clinic

A Beef Cattle (steers and heifers) Clinic will be held on <u>December 18</u> at the Bell County Expo Center. This clinic will be open to any 4-H or FFA families, whether novice or experienced. We will discuss the equipment that you need for a show, show preparation, feeding at the show, how to prepare at the show, and how to clip. In addition to this, the second portion of the clinic will be dedicated entirely to showmanship and how to present your project at the show. This clinic will provide <u>hands on</u> learning experience so all participants are encouraged to bring their steer or heifer projects to the Expo. Participants may begin stalling at 6:30 am and all animals must be in place by 8:00am. Registration will be



from 7:30 until 8:00a.m and the clinic will start at 9:00 and last until 2:00 p.m. Lunch and breakfast will be provided. The cost is \$15.00 per child (pre-registration) and \$25.00 day of registration. <u>The pre-entry</u> <u>deadline is December 10, 2010</u> and you can pre-register by paying at the Bell County Extension Office. The cost of the clinic will cover breakfast, lunch, and all clinic materials.

If you showed an animal at the State Fair of Texas and are expecting a check, please stop by the Extension Office and pick them up. These are premium checks and floor price checks.

Bell County Youth Fair Ride Nights

Sponsored by Texas AgriLife Extension Service & Bell County 4-H Horse Club

The official ride nights are correct in the BCYF rule book. Please notice the following schedule: January 25, and February 1st are performance nights.

January 24, and 31st are speed event nights.

Speed horses only on Speed nights, Performance horses only on Performance nights.

All 4-H, FFA and FCCLA members entered in the 2011 Horse Show events will get an invitation very soon from our office. I will be working with guest instructors and to finalize plans between now and January 21st. We have reduced the number of ride nights due to reduced participation over the past three years. The low numbers of youth attending on Mondays and Tuesdays early in the month did not justify the cost.

Rules for ride nights are included on page 6 of the Bell County Youth Fair Horse Show (GREEN) Catalogue, so please be familiar with them. Ride night events are only for the Contestants registered for competition in the Bell County Youth Fair Horse Show. Only their horses that are the primary or alternate horses signed up for the events in 2010. We will be checking for Coggins so have copies of current negative Coggins test results on all the horses you bring. Contestants must register each night and present Coggins paperwork to ride in the arenas.

We do not allow alcohol or smoking at anytime in the barn and no alcohol can be consumed in parking lot. Because this is an equine event, absolutely no dogs will be allowed on the grounds.

- We need every one of you to focus on safety.
- We will have EMS on site at every ride night this year from 6:00 to 10:00.
- Security Staff will be present from 6:00 to 10:00.
- We will again have inside tie up area available along the West side of the C barn arena.
- Since we have many horses that are not familiar with each other and riders that may not be familiar with crowded type conditions, we would like to again have appointed safety monitors for each night. The idea would be that the safety monitor would be stationed in the congested areas and be responsible for helping the youth understand how to make safe decisions. We are looking for volunteers that will be safety monitors. Please report any unsafe conditions to them. If you would like to volunteer e-mail or call Dirk at the CEO.
- The goal is that the ride nights help beginners and newer entrants feel comfortable, help them have fun and give them confidence to compete in future events. At the same time we will strive to provide a safe place for the more experienced riders to get ride time and practice. The ride nights will only be as good as we collectively make them, so your help is needed.
