

## Rabbit Clinic



Bell County 4-H will host 2 rabbit clinics in January. That's right, 2 rabbit clinics! The first will be held January 3 at 6:30 pm at the Bell County Expo Center Special Events room (upstairs). This clinic will focus only on Breeding Rabbits. We will discuss breeds, common disqualifications, care and health, showmanship, and rules specific to the Bell County Youth Fair Breeding Rabbit Show. The second rabbit clinic will be held January 12, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. at the Bell County Expo Center (upstairs). This clinic will be dedicated to fryer rabbits or meat pens. We will discuss feeding, weight management, fur quality, health, supplies needed, disqualifications, selection, and check-in procedures for the Bell County Youth Fair.

If you are new to showing rabbits or just want more information about how the Bell County Youth Fair Rabbit show works, don't miss these 2 great workshops.



### Hot and Spicy Salsa Event

Come one come all to the newest Food and Nutrition workshop. At this fun filled event we will be learning how to make several different types of salsa with several different ingredients. We will also be having a salsa contest! If you would like to compete you will need to bring your own quart jar full of HOMEMADE salsa. We will have a judge go around to taste and judge the salsas as well as have a kids choice award where you can vote for your favorite salsa. While we are waiting for the judging to be complete, we have a little surprise that all ages will enjoy. The Hot and Spicy Salsa Event will be at the County Extension Office at 9:00-11:00 am on the 25th of Feb.

The cost to come to this workshop will be \$10 but you can enter the salsa contest for \$5 per salsa entry and this includes your workshop fee! All registrations and fees will be due to the CEO by Feb. 13th. Salsa categories include mild, hot, and fruit salsa. Prizes will be given to the best salsa in each category, one over all, and kid's choice.



# Bell County Youth Fair Ride Nights

Sponsored by Texas AgriLife Extension Service & Bell 4-H Horse Club

The official ride nights are correct in the BCYF rule book. Please notice the following schedule:

January 24th and 31st are Performance nights. January 23rd and 30th are Speed event nights.

Speed horses only on Speed nights, Performance horses only on Performance nights.

Rules for ride nights are included on page 6 of the Bell County
Youth Fair Horse Show (BLUE) Catalogue, so please be familiar with
them. Ride night events are only for the Contestants registered for competition in the Bell
County Youth Fair Horse Show. Only their horses that are the primary or alternate horses
signed up for the events in 2012. We will be checking for Coggins so have copies of current
negative Coggins test results on all the horses you bring. Contestants must register each
night and present Coggins paperwork to ride in the arenas.

We do not allow alcohol or smoking at anytime in the barn and no alcohol can be consumed in parking lot. Because this is an equine event, absolutely no dogs will be allowed on the grounds.

- We need every one of you to focus on safety.
- We will have EMS on site at every ride night this year from 6:00 to 10:00.
- Security Staff will be present from 6:00 to 10:00.
- We will again have inside tie up area available along the West side of the C barn arena.
- Since we have many horses that are not familiar with each other and riders that may not be familiar with crowded type conditions, we would like to again have appointed safety monitors for each night. The idea would be that the safety monitor would be stationed in the congested areas and be responsible for helping the youth understand how to make safe decisions. We are looking for volunteers that will be safety monitors. Please report any unsafe conditions to them. If you would like to volunteer e-mail or call Micah at the CEO.
- The goal is that the ride nights help beginners and newer entrants feel comfortable, help them have fun and give them confidence to compete in future events. At the same time we will strive to provide a safe place for the more experienced riders to get ride time and practice. The ride nights will only be as good as we collectively make them, so your help is needed.


