Health Care — nurse on duty 24/7. All medications are administered by the nurse.

Meals — a full time staff provides three wholesome, balanced meals each day. Lunch and Dinner include a self-serve salad bar, ensuring there's something for everyone. Ready to meet special meal requirements, with advance notification.
