A 4-H recordbook is a “scrapbook” or “journal” of all the fun and interesting things you have discovered this year as a Clover Kids member.

Because the Clover Kids program is designed to be an introductory, non-competitive experience for Kindergarten to 2nd grade members, Clover Kids Recordbooks **will not** be judged. They will be reviewed for content and will receive special recognition at the annual Bell County 4-H Awards and Recognition Banquet held in the summer.

- Be neat.
- Be creative.
- Report activities of your 4-H work for the current 4-H year.
- Include pictures of your 4-H work for the current 4-H year.
- Be completed by the **Clover Kids member** and turned into the Bell County Extension Office **by the designated due date**.
