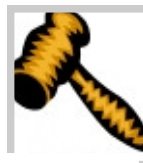

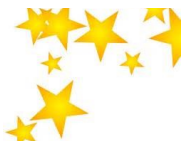

2021- 2022 Texas 4-H Council Delegate At Large

The Texas 4-H Council is a team of 4-H members elected by their peers from across the state of Texas. Serving as ambassadors for the Texas 4-H program, members represent the organization statewide while collaborating with Extension faculty to plan, coordinate, and facilitate activities and events.

- Texas 4-H Council membership will consist of a total of 30 delegates.
- A maximum of two delegates will be elected from each district in accordance with district by-laws.
- In addition to the elected District representatives, six at-large delegates will be elected by the entire Texas 4- H Program senior level membership during LEAD Academy/Texas 4-H Roundup. These six delegates have no restrictions or quotas regarding district representation.
- Delegates elected to the at-large positions will serve at the state level and will not have district responsibilities.
- Minimum age/grade requirements will have to be met by all delegates. Council members must be entering the 10th, 11th, or 12th grades and must be between the ages of 16 and 18 on August 31st of the calendar year in which they are installed on the Texas 4-H Council.
- All delegates must participate in a mandatory Texas 4-H Council Workshop held in the summer to become an official member of Texas 4-H Council.
- Applications will be accepted for the at-large positions and narrowed to a pool of applicants by a selection committee. The selection committee will be made up of the four Texas 4-H Council advisors and three current Texas 4-H Council members.
- Candidates elected at the state level for the at-large position **will not be eligible** for any position at the district level. Candidates not elected during the state level elections **are eligible** to run for a district position **given they meet district eligibility requirements.**

- be a current 4-H member, OR be willing to join a local 4-H club if selected

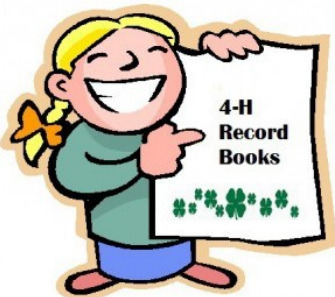

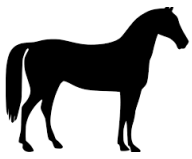

Bell County validations **REQUIRE** all 4-H and FFA members to order and pay for their tags prior to validation to ensure the correct number of tags are ordered. All orders must be handled through the Bell County Extension Office or placed online through the Bell Livestock Coalition Square Site by **April 16th, 2021**.

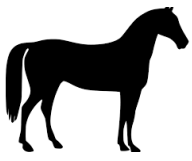
- Due to changes in the validation process, the steer tag fee will increase by \$5/tag in 2021. During physical validation, you will notice the elimination of nose printing. However, the Steer Validation program will be increasing their DNA testing volume for enhanced accuracy and efficiency.
- The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration for Registered Breeding Heifers is June 30, 2021. A color, PDF copy of the original registration papers should be emailed to your County Extension Agent or Ag Teacher by June 30, 2021.

State Fair of Texas & Heart O' Texas Fair Swine Validations: By appointment at the exhibitor's barn

- All Registered and Commercial Gilts must be validated for the State Fair of Texas and Heart O' Texas Fair. The date of ownership, transfer and registration must all be on or before June 30, 2021. For Registered gilts, registration papers must be uploaded into the validation system by July 15, 2021.

State Fair of Texas Sheep & Goat Validation: Monday, June 21st from 8:30 AM – 5:30 PM at Extension Office

- This year, all Registered/Commercial Breeding Sheep and Goats must be validated to be eligible to show at the State Fair of Texas. The Texas Lamb and Goat Validation program is also initiating a Roll-Over Breeding Sheep and Goat Validation program. Once validated, Breeding Sheep and Goat projects will be eligible for 3 years unless a change in ownership occurs. The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration is June 1, 2021. A color, PDF copy of the original registration papers should be emailed to Whitney.Grantham@ag.tamu.edu by June 30, 2021.

Horse Validation

Its that time of year to validate your horse(s) for the District 8 Horse Show and Texas 4-H Horse Show! Some of the fields within the system have been updated, so families with existing horse profiles will need to update some of their information when validating. Validation will be open

March 1st – April 15th at \$10 per validation and \$20 from April 16 until May 1.

REMINDERS:

- Horses must be validated in 4-H Connect every year.
- Only one validation per horse each year is necessary
- If the horse is registered then the registration papers must be uploaded during validation. The owner must be listed as the 4-Her, or a member of the 4-Hers immediate family (parent, sibling, grandparent, legal guardian).
- If the horse is grade (unregistered) then the field designated for the upload of registration papers should be left blank.
- Pictures need to be a visual representation of the horses color and markings (head and legs must be visible in right and left profile images and lighting should be sufficient to determine coat color)

Selection Criteria:

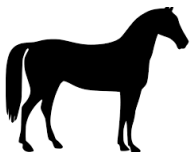
- Senior age (14-18) 4-H youth that have exhibited a superior level of ambition regarding horse projects
