OBJECTIVES:

- Youth in grades 9-12 at time of event, November 26-30, 2021.
- Youth must still be in high school during the time of the trip.


To be eligible to run for a District 8 4-H Council Office, 4-H members must meet the following requirements:

Registration fee is \$50 per contestant.



June Livestock Validation Reminders

Steer & Heifer Validations: Monday, June 28th from 7:00–10:00 AM & 4:00–7:00 PM at the Bell County EXPO

- The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration for Registered Breeding Heifers is June 30, 2021.

State Fair of Texas & Heart O' Texas Fair Swine Validations: By appointment at the exhibitor's barn

- All Registered and Commercial Gilts must be validated for the State Fair of Texas and Heart O' Texas Fair. The date of ownership, transfer and registration must all be on or before June 30, 2021.

State Fair of Texas Sheep & Goat Validation: Monday, June 21st from 8:30 AM–5:30 PM at Extension Office

- This year, all Registered/Commercial Breeding Sheep and Goats must be validated to be eligible to show at the State Fair of Texas. The Texas Lamb and Goat Validation program is also initiating a Roll-Over Breeding Sheep and Goat Validation program. Once validated, Breeding Sheep and Goat projects will be eligible for 3 years unless a change in ownership occurs. The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration is June 30, 2021.


Save the Date


Horse Validation

It's that time of year to validate your horse(s) for the District 8 Horse Show and Texas 4-H Horse Show! Some of the fields within the system have been updated, so families with existing horse profiles will need to update some of their information when validating. Validation will be open

March 1st – April 15th at \$10 per validation and \$20 from April 16 until May 1.

REMINDERS:

- Horses must be validated in 4-H Connect every year.
- Only one validation per horse each year is necessary
- If the horse is registered then the registration papers must be uploaded during validation. The owner must be listed as the 4-Her, or a member of the 4-Hers immediate family (parent, sibling, grandparent, legal guardian).
- If the horse is grade (unregistered) then the field designated for the upload of registration papers should be left blank.
- Pictures need to be a visual representation of the horses color and markings (head and legs must be visible in right and left profile images and lighting should be sufficient to determine coat color)


Stalls are available at an estimated \$20.00 per night on a first-come first-serve basis. **Stall fees will be paid to the Expo Center staff at time of arrival. Stalls will not be available on Sunday. Stalls will be available starting at 8:00 a.m. through 10:00 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 2021. DO NOT SEND STALL FEES WITH ENTRIES.**

RV Hookups are available at \$20 per night.

New for this year:

- The switching out of a horse will be permitted and will require a \$10, with the exception of those who are switching out a horse due to medical reasons, which must be accompanied by a letter from their veterinarian.
- **LATE ENTRIES AND CLASS ADDITIONS:** After the entry deadline, a 4-H member may add a class with the class entry fee plus a \$10 per class late entry fee. A 4-H may enter the show site but will be charged a late fee of \$50 (flat rate), plus the \$10 per class late entry fee. The 4-H member will be required to present the necessary paperwork (i.e. Medical Waiver and Coggins Paperwork), to be considered for entry.

The Texas 4-H Livestock Ambassador program strives to provide high school aged 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills related to mentoring other youth, and to become advocates for animal agriculture.



Selection Criteria:

- Senior age (14-18) 4-H youth that have exhibited a superior level of ambition regarding his/her livestock projects
- Students with a profound interest in animal science, animal production and advocacy
- Students have shown advanced leadership qualities and a willingness to help others
- Top 25% class rank

Application Process:

- a. Student will complete the application and enter the contact information of supervising CEA
- b. CEA will be automatically emailed a recommendation survey
- c. A selection committee will review the applications and accept up to 25 participants per university
- d. Applications are due **May 1, 2021**

***Applicants will be notified if they have been accepted/denied.**

***An application does not ensure entrance into the program. The program is limited to 25 participants per short course.**
