4-H Enrollment

4-H Enrollment starts <u>August 15th</u>! All enrollment is done via the NEW 4HOnline 2.0. You can access 4HOnline 2.0 by going to our 4-H website at http://agrilife.org/bell4h/ and clicking on the 4HOnline icon.

A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for correct fees to be charged.

To maintain the level of programming and opportunities in the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, an annual participant fee is implemented for each 4-H member (excluding Clover Kids). The participant fee is \$25 if enrolled from August 15th to October 31st, November 1st the participant fee will increase to \$30.

All volunteers who enroll will be charged \$10.00. This covers your screening for the year. All volunteers will have to re-enroll each year. Club Managers must enroll ASAP!

Bell County Youth Fair Eligibility

All BCYF exhibitors MUST attend <u>2</u> meetings from <u>August 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022</u> to participate in the 2022 Bell County Youth Fair. Please make sure that you sign in at every club meeting you attend.

Your name must be on the sign in sheets for it to count!

All 4-H members MUST be enrolled by <u>**December 10, 2022</u>** to participate in the BCYF. However, the fee will go up after October 31st so do it quickly.</u>

Academic Eligibility & Excused Absences for 4-H Competitions and Activities

To participate in any 4-H competitions, contestants must be enrolled in 4-H and academically eligible according to their school. For public/private schooled students, the Extension Office will work with those schools to obtain academic eligibility and request excused absences when appropriate. If a member is participating in a 4-H event/competition, please contact the agent advising that project area at least two week in advance of the event to communicate when the child will be missing school. All home schooled students will need to turn in an academic eligibility form by email at least one week prior to the event.
