2024 Bell County Youth Fair & Major Livestock Show Turkeys Order Deadline: June 1st, 2023

Cost: \$4.75 per bird; min order of 5, max of 75 birds per family unit/exhibitor Turkeys will be straight-run (toms and hens randomly mixed).

Each exhibitor may order an individual set of birds OR siblings within the same household may order and share a set of birds. Major show birds may also be used for the county show.

Estimated pick up is November 7-17th, 2023.

June Livestock Validation Tag Order Information & Changes for 2023

Steer & Heifer Validation: Monday, June 19 from 7:00–10:00 AM & 4:00–6:00 PM at the Bell County EXPO REGISTERED HEIFERS: The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration for Registered Breeding Heifers is June 30, 2023. A color, PDF copy of the original registration papers should be emailed to your County Extension Agent or Ag Teacher by June 30, 2023.

NEW FOR 2023 All state validated heifers will be tagged similar to steers. This will bring our heifer validation program in line with breeding sheep, breeding goats, and breeding gilts.

- 1. Heifers already validated do NOT have to be revalidated or have a tag. Heifers ONLY need to be revalidated if they change breed or ownership.
- 2. If your heifer has a previously existing 840 premise ID tag, there will be retag form/process, in coordination with TAHC, to remove the tag and replace with an official Texas Validation 840 tag. More information will be forthcoming on the official process and form for doing so.

State Fair of Texas & Heart O' Texas Fair Swine Validation: **By appointment at the exhibitor or school barn** All Registered and Commercial Gilts must be validated for the State Fair of Texas and Heart O' Texas Fair. **REGISTERED GILTS:** The date of ownership, transfer, and registration must all be on or before June 30, 2023. A color, PDF copy of the original registration papers should be emailed to your County Extension Agent or Ag Teacher by June 30, 2023.

State Fair of Texas Sheep & Goat Validation: Thursday, June 15th from 8:30 AM-5:00 PM at the Extension Office **NEW** FOR 2023 Lambs and goats validated during the 2023 State Fair Validation Period will be eligible for 2024 Spring Major Shows. Market animals validated for the 2023 State Fair will carryover for 2024 Spring Major Shows. Once validated, the project must stay in the care of the exhibitor that project is validated to; if the exhibitor chooses to sell the project to a new exhibitor, the new exhibitor must revalidate the project within the next validation period. Please see the Validation Guidelines for more details.

BREEDING SHEEP & GOATS: All Registered and Commercial Breeding Sheep and Goats must be validated to be eligible to show at the State Fair of Texas. Once validated, Breeding Sheep and Goat projects will be eligible for 3 years unless a change in ownership occurs. The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration is June 30, 2023. A color, PDF copy of the original registration papers should be emailed to Whitney.Ingram@ag.tamu.edu by June 30, 2023.
