4-H Enrollment

4-H Enrollment started on <u>August 15th</u>! All enrollments are done via 4HOnline. You can access 4HOnline by going to our 4-H website at http://agrilife.org/bell4h/ and clicking on the 4HOnline icon. <u>V2.4honline.com</u>.

A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for correct fees to be charged.

To maintain the level of programming and opportunities in the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, an annual participant fee is implemented for each 4-H member. The participant fee is \$25 if enrolled from August 15th to October 31st, November 1st the participant fee will increase to \$30. NEW THIS YEAR, Clover Kids will now be charged a \$10 annual participation fee.

Please do not worry if you are still pending at the county level once you have enrolled. The county office will try to keep up as best as we can by approving them at least once a week. As long as you complete your enrollment, you are in the system and good for enrollment and BCYF requirements. Enrollment dues must be paid by an electronic payment.

All volunteers who enroll will be charged \$10.00. This covers your screening for the year. All volunteers will have to re-enroll each year. Club Managers must enroll ASAP!

4-H Age /Grade Requirements

Texas 4-H membership eligibility will be based on SCHOOL GRADE and not age. The eligibility rules and guidelines are:

Youth may participate in 4-H year from September 1st of grade three through August 31st following completion of grade twelve, with these age restrictions:

Minimum age - 8 (as of August 31, 2023 and in the 3rd grade)

Maximum age - 18 (as of August 31, 2023)

Major Show Entry Forms Deadline

The Bell County 4-H Major Show Entry Deadline is **November 6th!** We will be open from 8:00 AM - 6:00 PM on November 6th to accept entry forms. All required paperwork must be filled out completely and turned in with original signatures before the deadline. Emailed forms will not be accepted. Entries without payment will not be accepted. Exact cash or checks can be made payable to the Bell Livestock Coalition. If you would like to pay by credit card, a 3% fee will be added to cover service charges. As entry forms are released from the shows, a PDF version will be posted at https://agrilife.org/bell4h/projects/4-h-livestock/. You may fill and print the PDF versions at home. Also, paper copies of the entry forms will also be available at the Bell County Extension Office. To ensure that all entries from Bell County 4-H are processed and checked thoroughly,

no entries will be accepted after the November 6th deadline!

2024 Major Show Sheep and Goat Validation Notes

October 17th and 24th; Cadence Bank Center - Exposition Building; 4:00 - 7:00 PM

- When exhibitors arrive to the Cadence Bank Center, two lines will form for validation. The line going into the barn on the left will be for county only validations. The line on the right will be for both major show and county show validations. If you have any major show animals on your trailer, you will need to be in the line on the right.
- A parent of the exhibitor must be present during validation to complete required paperwork. If your livestock are not housed at a school barn and the physical address of your livestock is different than your home address, please email Whitney.Ingram@ag.tamu.edu to let her know in advance.
- *NEW FOR 2023* All lambs and goats validated during the 2023 State Fair Validation period including market animals WILL BE ELIGIBLE for 2024 Spring Major Shows. Once validated, the project MUST stay in the care of the exhibitor that project is validated to; if the exhibitor chooses to sell the project to a new exhibitor, the new exhibitor MUST REVALIDATE the project within the next validation period.
- Texas Lamb Breeders Association (TLBA) and Texas Goat Breeders Association (TGBA) tag numbers MUST be in the animal's ear to be recorded on the validation form at validation. All lambs and goats planning to go to San Angelo MUST have TLBA/TGBA tags in their ear and the number recorded on their validation form.
- If a TLBA/TGBA tag is added to the animal's ear after the State Fair show season, then the animal must be re-validated during the Major Show Validation season in order for the TLBA/TGBA tag number to be properly recorded on the Validation Form and eligible for TLBA/TGBA premiums during the spring show season.
- In 2021, Sheep and Goat Validation of Texas announced the introduction of the Roll-over Breeding Sheep and Breeding Goat program. For example, any BREEDING animal validated during the State Fair 2021 validation period is eligible to be exhibited by that exhibitor through the State Fair 2024 show season. If ownership changes, then the animal must be re-validated.
- All sheep and goats are eligible for family validation. Registered sheep and goats can family validate if the registration papers have all exhibitors full names listed as owners. Registration paper ownership will determine the exhibitors eligible to show that project.
- All Market Lambs, Market Goats, Breeding Sheep, Wether Dams, Breeding Goats, and Wether Does will use the same RFID validation tag.
- **Registered Breeding Sheep & Goat Exhibitors:** The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration is October 1, 2023. A color PDF copy of the original registration papers should be emailed to Whitney.ingram@ag.tamu.edu prior to validation.

2024 Major Show Heifer Validation Notes

October 23th; Cadence Bank Center - Exposition Building Pavilion; 4:00 - 6:00 PM

- Heifers already validated do NOT have to be revalidated or have a tag. Heifers ONLY need to be revalidated if they change breed or ownership. If you have leftover tags from June validation, you may use them this fall.
- Heifers that have existing 840 tags (bangs/premise ID/etc.), tags will not have to be removed. However, these will NOT take the place of a validation 840 tag. In other words, a heifer can have more than one 840 tag in their ear or you can remove previous tags; but regardless, the animal has to have a validation 840 tag. We will have a specific form for you to complete at the time of validation for any previously existing 840 tags that are removed to remain in compliance with TAHC/USDA.
- **Registered Heifer Exhibitors:** The deadline for ownership, transfer, and registration for Registered Breeding Heifers is November 1, 2023. A color PDF copy of the original registration papers must be emailed to Whitney.ingram@ag.tamu.edu prior to validation.

Club Managers, please make sure you have a sign in sheet at each meeting and announce to all members to sign in before, during, and after the meeting.

- BCYF has a website in which everything will be posted including the new fair book, entry forms, superintendent's names and phone numbers, score sheets, and other information: http://agrilife.org/bellctvyouthfair/
- You MUST attend 2 meetings to participate in the BCYF. Your name MUST be on the sign in sheets for it to count.
- 2 meetings will be allowed from <u>August 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023</u> this year. No meetings will be allowed in January to use for the 2 meeting rule.
- All 4-H members MUST be enrolled by **December 10, 2023** to participate in the BCYF. However, the fee will go up after October 31st, so do it quickly.
