4-H Enrollment

4-H Enrollment started on <u>August 15th</u>! All enrollments are done via 4HOnline. You can access 4HOnline by going to our 4-H website at http://agrilife.org/bell4h/ and clicking on the 4HOnline icon. <u>V2.4honline.com</u>.

A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for correct fees to be charged.

To maintain the level of programming and opportunities in the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, an annual participant fee is implemented for each 4-H member. The participant fee is \$25 if enrolled from August 15th to October 31st, November 1st the participant fee will increase to \$30. NEW THIS YEAR, Clover Kids will now be charged a \$10 annual participation fee.

Please do not worry if you are still pending at the county level once you have enrolled. The county office will try to keep up as best as we can by approving them at least once a week. As long as you complete your enrollment, you are in the system and good for enrollment and BCYF requirements. Enrollment dues must be paid by an electronic payment.

Minimum age - 8 (as of August 31, 2023 and in the 3rd grade)

Maximum age - 18 (as of August 31, 2023)

Major Show Entry Forms Deadline

Bell County Major Show Entry Day is Monday, November 6th! PLEASE READ ALL SECTIONS.

All forms must be turned in to the Extension Office with payment and original signatures. Our normal office hours are from 8 AM-Noon and 1–5 PM, but on November 6th, we will be open from 8 AM-6 PM, all day.

To ensure that all entries from Bell County 4-H are processed and checked thoroughly, no entries will be accepted after the November 6th deadline!

Stock Show Entry Forms:

- To prefill and print your own entry forms, visit https://agrilife.org/bell4h/projects/4-h-livestock/ or use the links to each entry form on page 4 in the attached 2024 Major Show Dates and Entry Forms!
- We will also have copies of the forms available at the office.
- Please visit the show websites to access forms for Calf Scramble and individual contests. Let me know if there is an entry form that you need help finding.

Special Notes:

- Paper forms must be filled out completely and submitted with original signatures.
- Fort Worth requires 1 entry form per animal. All other shows require 1 entry form per exhibitor.
- Houston entries must be notarized! We will have a notary available on our Major Show Entry Day.
- All exhibitors must complete the Quality Counts Certification prior to entry. The course must be completed once as a Junior (grades 3-5), Intermediate (grades 6-8), and Senior (grades 9-12). To register, view the attached instruction sheet. For help with technical issues, please email learnonline@ag.tamu.edu. Exact cash or checks can be made payable to the Bell Livestock Coalition. Credit Card payments will incur a 3% fee. Entry forms will not be accepted without payment.
- When filling out your entry forms for statewide shows, please use **Bell County 4-H** rather than your specific club name.

Gate & Parking Passes:

Do not forget to add your gate and parking passes! I recommend ordering what you need at the time of entry. **Fort Worth**: Each exhibitor will receive 1 complimentary gate pass per entry, with a maximum of 4 complimentary passes per exhibitor. Exhibitors with 1-5 entries are allowed to purchase up to 2 parking passes, 6 or more entries are allowed to purchase up to 3 parking passes. If you would like more parking passes per exhibitor, please visit with me.

Texas' Elite & Sandhills: There will be no required gate pass or vehicle pass to enter the grounds.

Houston: 1 complimentary grounds pass will be given per exhibitor regardless of the number of entries. Parking Passes are allotted based on total club/chapter entries and the limited number of parking passes will be shared by exhibitors. In other words, there are no parking passes for purchase.

San Angelo, San Antonio, & Austin: 1 complimentary grounds pass will be given per exhibitor regardless of the number of entries. Additional grounds and parking passes are available for purchase with no limits.
