County to Brownwood this year.

WHO WILL

ATTEND: All District 4-H Council officers plus representatives from each county.

All participants must be at least 13 years of age by the date of the

Leadership Lab. No graduating seniors who are ineligible to

participate in 4-H for the 2018-2019 4-H year may attend. However,

current officers who are graduating are allowed to attend.

REGISTRATION: Registration will be conducted on 4-H Connect May 1 - May 31, 2018.

LATE REGISTRATION will be available from June 1-4, 2018 ONLY

so please plan ahead. We must abide by the 1:8 ratio for adult

chaperones.

DRESS CODE: NO: "Daisy duke" shorts, halter tops, spaghetti string tops, shirts

that show mid-riff, or clothing, caps etc. that advertise alcohol, tobacco products or anything else that is not appropriate.

HEALTH & RELEASE



Every participant, youth, and adults, will need to complete a Health and Release form packet. Forms are included in this letter and will be available to download from 4-H Connect. Please print 3 copies of the Health and Release forms, sign (original signatures are needed) and send 2 to our office by May 30th. Keep one for you take the form with you to camp.

WHAT TO BRING: Everyone will need to bring their own toiletry items (soap, shampoo,

etc), clothing, and other personal items. BEDDING IS **ALSO**NEEDED!!! **For recreation:** swimsuit, sturdy shoes for active games, old tennis shoes, water shoes, some clothes that can get

dirty/ruined.

WHAT NOT TO BRING: Ropes, roping dummies, fireworks, excessive food/drinks, gum

and expensive jewelry. If cell phones, IPods, etc. become a distraction, they will be confiscated and returned at the end of camp!!!! They will NOT be allowed during activities, assemblies.

MEMO TO: BEXAR COUNTY 4-H MEMBERS

SUBJECT: DISTRICT 4-H COUNCIL OFFICER ELECTION

The election of officers for the District 10 4-H Council will take place at the Texas 4-H Center during Leadership Lab, June 26-29, 2018.

To be eligible for an office, 4-Hers must have attended District Leadership Lab at least one year prior to running for office. This amendment was made to the District 4-H Council Standing Rules.

Qualified delegates interested in seeking Council office must apply <u>by completing the</u> application on the District 10 Website starting <u>May 1, 2018</u> and Submitting no later than <u>MAY 31.</u> <u>2018</u>. Applications will be accepted online only and it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure their application was received. Application can be found at <a href="http://d104-http://

Candidates will participate in a question/answer session in front of the voting delegates following speeches. Candidates will be sent a list of potential questions in May. Each candidate will be asked 2 questions from the list and one question that is not on the list. This will provide an opportunity for the voting delegates to see how well candidates think on their feet.

Candidates who apply will be allowed to bring ONE poster board size (22 inches X 28 inches) campaign poster to Lab! No other campaign materials will be allowed, i.e. candy, flyers, gum, etc.

REQUIRED WORKSHOPS/TRAINING

The District Council <u>President, 1st Vice-President and Delegate-at-Large</u> also serve as members of the Texas 4-H Council and must be 16 years of age and not reached their 18th birthday on or before **August 31, 2018**. *In addition, they must be a student in 10th, 11th, or 12th grade the year they are serving on council.*

<u>State Council Members</u> are <u>REQUIRED</u> to attend the State 4-H Council workshop. If you cannot attend this training you cannot run for these three offices. Please see attached document on requirements for Texas 4-H Council

All other officers must be 14 years of age and not reached their 18th birthday on or before **August 31**, **2018**. <u>All</u> District 10 Officers are <u>REQUIRED</u> to attend the District 10 Officer Training.

Job descriptions for each office are attached. Serving as an officer of the District Council requires time and effort but it also provides leadership opportunities and other rewards.
