## Virtual National 4-H Shooting Sports Quiz Bowl

Save the dates: June 22 through 26, 2020.
This is a state, regional, and national event for individuals and team play.
Quiz Bowl Guidelines:

1. One quiz will be available for each age division, through Kahoot, starting June 22 at 12:00 AM PT. The tests will close at 12:00 AM PT, June 27.
2. The quiz will incorporate subject matter from all disciplines and include content on 4-H, 4-H Shooting sports, positive youth development, and risk management.
3. The junior quiz will consist of 30 questions. The intermediate/senior quiz will consist of 50 questions. Questions range from multiple choice, true/false, fill in the blank, and identification.
4. Resource materials and registration instructions will be available on the National 4-H Shooting Sports web page.
5. Individuals and teams will be divided into two age divisions for the 2019-2020 4-H year. Juniors are less than 14 years of age based on state enrollment dates (no Cloverbuds).
Intermediates/seniors are 14 to 19 years of age based on state enrollment dates. Teams must be formed prior to beginning the Quiz Bowl.
6. Teams will consist of 3 to 4 members. Because the quizzes are comprehensive (covering archery, hunting skills, muzzle loading, pistol, rifle, shotgun, and western heritage), teams should be made up of individuals with knowledge of one or more of these disciplines. Teams do not need to be made up of individuals from the same club or county.
7. Points are awarded based on correct answers, the time taken to answer questions, and answer streak. Raw scores will be used to identify individual winners. Team members compete as individuals. The sum of the top three raw scores per team will be used to determine team placement. (i.e. the lowest score on a four member team will be dropped). States will be notified of individual and team ranking from first to last. It will be up to each state to determine appropriate recognition.
8. State individual and team scores will then be compared regionally (North Central, North East, Southern, and Western). States and regions will be notified of individual and team ranking from first to last. The top individual will receive a rosette and $1^{\text {st }}$ place ribbon. Individuals finishing $2^{\text {nd }}$ through $10^{\text {th }}$ will receive placement ribbons. The top team will receive rosettes and $1^{\text {st }}$ place ribbons. Teams finishing $2^{\text {nd }}$ through $10^{\text {th }}$ will receive placement ribbons.
9. Regional scores will then be compared and ranked from first to last to determine the winning national individual and team. The top individual will receive a medallion, rosette and $1^{\text {st }}$ place ribbon. Individuals finishing $2^{\text {nd }}$ through $10^{\text {th }}$ will receive placement ribbons. The top team will receive medallions, rosettes and $1^{\text {st }}$ place ribbons. Teams finishing $2^{\text {nd }}$ through $10^{\text {th }}$ will receive placement ribbons.
