1. Competition is open to all Brazoria County 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, and YAC members in good standing (up-to-date attendance and scholastically eligible per Senate Bill 1).
2. Entry forms and division descriptions will be available at <https://www.brazoriacountyfair.com/> or <http://agrillife.org/brazoria4h/>
3. **An exhibitor may enter only one (1) item per class in each division with a maximum of 20 entries.** **NEW:** 4-H Clover Members will only be able to enter two items per division. Furthermore in Division IV, Baked Confections, Clover Members will only be able to enter one Cookie entry (25 or 26 or 27) and the Candy Class 30. All items must be constructed by the exhibitor.
4. Explanations on the work put into the project are encouraged and may be neatly written or typed on a 3x5 card and attached to the item. (Ex. Kit, made from scratch, etc.)
5. All small items must be placed in zip lock bags. The committee is not responsible for lost or broken items.
6. NO food or candy may be used in the projects.
7. Photography Entries will be entered digitally and will be saved with exhibitor and class number. If entering photography division, contact Lesliejhargrove@gmail.com for exhibitor number. Exhibitor should save photos to a flash drive and copy photo files over to designated computer. *(Name files Class#.exhibitor# example: 44.201)*
8. Points earned in Class 62, Miniscapes, will not count towards high point unless entered individually.
9. Entries, except potted plants, may not have been entered in a previous Brazoria County Fair. Items entered must have been completed since County Fair.
10. Items not of show quality, not in accordance to the rules, or not entered in the proper class will be disqualified prior to judging. Items must be entered in the most correct class. If there is a class for the item, exhibitor cannot put the same type of item in the "any other" classes.
11. Entry tags (except exhibitor number) and scholastic eligibility forms should be completed prior to check in.

12. Exhibitors should bring their entry form and tagged entries along with their Scholastic Eligibility Statement to the Hall of Exhibits Building between 9am and 3pm on Saturday, October 9th for check in. **Please use the main check in for all Hall of Exhibits contests to pay entry fee. Then bring items and entry forms to JCCA check-in.** No substitute exhibitors will be allowed.
13. All participants must comply with the General Rules and Regulations of the Brazoria County Fair except as otherwise designated.
14. Cakes can be picked up on October 9, 2021 at 4:00pm in the Sebesta Building. All other items must be picked up by 11:00am on Sunday October 24, 2021.
15. Recipes winning Grand Champion are ineligible to be entered in the next fair by any exhibitor. Exhibitors winning Grand Champion cannot use the same recipe again until they have changed age divisions.

AWARDS

1. Judging results will be posted Friday, October 15, 2021
2. Ribbons will be awarded to all entries including blue, red, white, and participation. Each entry will be judged on its own merit.
3. Outstanding ribbon awards may be selected from blue ribbon winners in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior age brackets of each division. If judges feel no entry in a division merits an "outstanding", none will be given. There will be a maximum of 10% of outstanding ribbons given out in each age bracket within each division. Best of Show ribbon awards will be selected from outstanding ribbons and given to one Junior, Intermediate, and Senior exhibitor in each division.
4. Cakes winning an Outstanding ribbon will be considered for Grand Champion in each age bracket. One cookie from the combined cookie classes (25, 26 and 27) will be selected as Grand Champion in each age bracket.
5. Grand Champion cakes and cookies, in each age bracket, will be re-baked and sold in the Auction. Only one auction item per exhibitor may be sold from this department. Exhibitors selling their Grand Champion cake or cookies **MUST** be present to thank the buyer and take a photo. **The 2019 Grand Champion Winners were: Brinley Peltier – Lemon Blueberry Cake with Lemon Frosting, Madelyn Taylor - Macaroons, Allyson Smith – Big Momma Megginson’s 5 Egg Pound Cake, Crysten Short – Hello Dolly Bars, Kassidy Osburn – Chocolate Oreo Cake, Suzanna Gonzales – Salted Carmel Crunch Cookies**
6. Point System: Blue - 4, Red - 3, White - 2, Participation - 0, Outstanding - 10, Grand Champion or Best of Show – 15. In order to qualify for a high point award, the exhibitor must have received at least one Outstanding, Best of Show or Grand Champion ribbon.
7. First Place High Point through Fifth Place will receive a trophy. Winners being recognized at the Awards program will be contacted by the committee Thursday, October 14, 2021. In the event of a tie, the number of Outstanding ribbons will be used as a tie breaker. First Place High Point Recipient is not eligible the following year. **2019 High Point winner was Taylor Ullrich – Sweeny 4-H**

8. First through Fifth Place High Point awards, *Best of Show certificates, and Grand Champion certificates* will be given at the Awards Ceremony Sunday, October 17, 2021 at 4:00pm in the Entertainment Hall. *All other ribbons can be picked up at JCCA checkout.*
