Old Business –

- Asking for Horse Group to pay for Title for Trailer
- Robotics Request – discussed increased budget for equipment since Grant was not funded
 - Discussed getting 6 kits, but that would not help without additional laptops/ipads
 - Concern about what kits were allowed at District 9 and State
 - Decided to have a committee meeting to discuss Robotics concerns before voting
- Need advanced notice for committee meetings instead of day of notice
- Cassidy would to see about getting a Squeeze Chute for validations.
- Talk about renting a Chute and adding a Tag Fee for Chute to validation tags. Subject was tabled to research prices
- 2021-22 Budget was presented by Leslie Hargrove. Curtis Sheffield made a motion to approve the budget, Glen Woosley seconded and the motion passed unanimously
- Market Days – using 4-H Promotion and Entrepreneurship budget; people asking for pecans but not ordering extras anymore; maybe get 1 lb pecans and chocolate and white pecans in future; will look at prior year sales
- From Club orders turned in, present profit from Pecans are \$12,787. There will be left over pecans to purchase
- Jr Lab – 5 junior members and 1 teen leader went and will be reimbursed
- Validation File boxes are needed for each species animal are needed and push cart – It was discussed that there are some push cart that need to be found that the Parent Association has. A motion made by Curtis Sheffield to allot \$200 for file boxes and a push cart (if none are found), Glen Woosley seconded; motion passed
- Will look in d9 trailer and upstairs for push carts, one cart went missing at county fair

New Business –

- Jackets for Pecans are more expensive due to inflation – decided to stay with current supplier
 - Judy Hammelman made the motion to stay with current jacket supplier, Keila seconded the motion, motion passed
