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Egg to Chick (Embryology) 30-Day Project Overview

Project Duration:

• 30 days total: 21 days for incubation and 8 days for staging with the baby chicks.

Educational Requirements:

• Teachers must provide at least **6 hours of educational instruction** based on the curriculum during the program.

Post-Hatch Responsibilities:

• Schools and teachers must find reliable homes for the baby chicks within a week after hatching. It is **not recommended** to send chicks home with students. Ideally, they should go to farms or individuals who will raise them for food or eggs.

Chick Allocation:

• Each classroom can hatch between **1-12 baby chicks**. The program provides **12 eggs (one dozen)** per classroom.

Curriculum Overview:

- **ChickQuest**: This Ohio Extension Curriculum is suitable for 3rd 6th grades and is available in hard copies. It includes a facilitator guide and a logbook for records. It is recommended to purchase one combo per classroom. Teachers can make copies of the logbook pages if needed.

 - The teacher's guide includes a helpful poster. There is a 21-Day Calendar poster for tracking the incubation process available to purchase as well. The curriculum can also be found on the 4-H National Mall: https://shop4-h.org/, but the calendar poster is only available in the ChickQuest curriculum web link provided.

Equipment and Supplies:

- Schools are responsible for providing the necessary equipment and supplies. <u>Check within your district for available resources.</u>
- **Tractor Supply Co.** is a 4-H national supporter, and purchasing from them supports the 4-H program in Dallas County. Items can also be bought from other retailers like Amazon, Walmart, or local feed stores. The links provided are for reference purposes.

Program Cost:

\$50.00 per classroom. This fee covers the cost of fertilized eggs, training, and program support. It includes one dozen fertilized eggs and 3 hours of CPE credits for teachers/facilitators.

Egg Delivery:

Fertilized eggs are sourced from Texas A&M University's Poultry Department. Delivery logistics will be coordinated, with a start hatching date set during teacher training.

Teacher/Facilitator Training:

- Training covers program logistics and the ChickQuest curriculum. Virtual training may be available, but face-to-face is preferred.
- Training dates: <u>March 5, 2025</u>, for all schools/organizations, and <u>March 6, 2025</u>, for Duncanville ISD only.

Program Support:

Ongoing support will be available throughout the program for any questions or suggestions.

Post-Program Evaluation:

Schools must evaluate the program based on participant knowledge gain and application. Surveys will be provided for teachers to distribute to students.
