





### FORT BEND COUNTY FARM BUREAU ACHIEVEMENT AND ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

2019

One or more scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 will be awarded to outstanding students of agriculture by the Fort Bend County Farm Bureau.

To qualify for this award, the following guidelines must be met or exceeded:

- 1. Applicant's parent or guardian must have been members of the Fort Bend County Farm Bureau in good standing on the September 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the student's high school graduation date, and membership must be current as of the date of scholarship award.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating senior from one of the public or private high schools located in Fort Bend County or home-schooled as a permanent resident of Fort Bend County.
- 3. Applicant shall demonstrate involvement in extracurricular and academic activities while enrolled in a high school.
- 4. Applicant shall demonstrate involvement in FFA or 4H activities and has been a member of a 4H club or FFA chapter at least two out of the last four years. A 4-H or FFA advisor must sign the application to verify the membership.
- 5. Applicant may choose any field of advanced education above high school level.
- 6. Applicant must plan to enroll in an accredited college, university, or technical school in the fall semester immediately following high school graduation.
- 7. Applicant shall demonstrate involvement in community and service activities while enrolled in a high school.
- 8. Applicant must submit a properly completed official Fort Bend County Farm Bureau Scholarship Application. The application must include on a separate piece of paper a typed biographical essay of 200 words or less summarizing the applicant's future plans.

### FORT BEND COUNTY FARM BUREAU ACHIEVEMENT AND ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

- 9. Deadline for applications is **March 30<sup>th</sup>**. Applications can be left in our night drop if the 30<sup>th</sup> falls on a weekend. Please submit one (1) original and two (2) copies of the completed application, including one (1) current photo (wallet size or larger). The applications must be received in the Fort Bend County Farm Bureau office at 5253 Highway 36, PO Box 271, Rosenberg, Texas 77471 on or before the application deadline. Applications shall be placed in a sealed envelope with "Scholarship Application" printed on the outside envelope. *No faxed or emailed applications will be accepted*.
- 10. The Fort Bend County Farm Bureau Board of Directors will review the submitted applications and select the winner(s). Applications will be evaluated as follows:

Community and Service Activities	15 points
4H or FFA Activities	50 points
High School and Academics Activities	20 points

### FORT BEND 4-H A. P. GEORGE SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

The Fort Bend 4-H A. P. George Scholarship Committee will be responsible for investing scholarship funds, determining the number of scholarships to be given each year and selecting the individuals receiving the scholarships. The amount of the scholarship shall be \$1,000 unless otherwise voted on.

### **Eligibility/ Requirements**

- 1. Applicants must be a graduating senior and/or have completed the 12th grade but can apply up to one (1) year following graduation. They may apply a total of two (2) times and receive only once.
- 2. Applicants do not have to be Fort Bend County residents, but they must have been active in the Fort Bend County 4-H Program for at least three (3) consecutive years.
- 3. Two (2) letters of recommendation (relatives or Extension Agents not included) must be submitted with application and Record Book.
- 4. Applicant must have completed and presented for judging at least three (3) consecutive senior division Record Books prior to applying for scholarship.
  - a. Only "original" Record Books may be submitted to the Scholarship Committee for consideration.

    Applicant may be disqualified for any deviation from this rule.
- 5. One (1) complete official sealed copy of high school transcript or equivalent and an official sealed copy of college transcript (if applicable). The transcript should reflect the previous fall semester.
- 6. A statement or letter from principal or counselor stating the Grade Point Average (if not on transcript).
- 7. A completed copy of the Fort Bend 4-H A. P. George Scholarship Application Form.
- 8. Give a personal interview before the interview panel. No taped interviews are allowed.
- 9. All applicants must submit a completed, signed application with checklist along with the "original" Record Book. Applicants must follow all criterion/rules set forth on the Fort Bend 4-H A. P. George Scholarship application. If all is not completed and signed accordingly, applicant will be disqualified.
- 10. All required paperwork is due along with the Record Book in the County Extension Office the Second Tuesday of April by 5:00 p.m. unless otherwise notified by the Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, Parents and Friends.
- 11. The County Extension Agent for 4-H & Youth Development, along with the scholarship committee will review all Record Books, applications, transcripts, letters of recommendation, and signatures to determine whether each applicant is eligible for scholarship.

### **Rules and Regulations**

- 1. The Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, Parents and Friends will determine the maximum number of scholarships that may be awarded based on available funds.
- 2. Applicants will be judged by an outside panel consisting of a group selected by the Fort Bend County Extension Agent. The Judges may not be related to any of the applicants.
- 3. The selected judges will score applicants according to the point system listed below.
- 4. Applicants must score a minimum of 70 points on a 100 Point System for scholarship eligibility.
- 5. The Point System will be as follows:

a. Application		4 Points
b. Checklist		1 Point
c. Record Book and 4-H Project Involvement		35 Points
d. 4-H Leadership & 4-H Community Involvement		30 Points
e. Participation in 4-H County Fundraising		10 Points
f. Interview		15 Points
g. GPA		5 Points
	Total:	100 Points

- 6. The County Extension Agents will provide training to the judging panel on the scoring system to be used.
- 7. All scholarship recipients will be eligible to draw up to half of the awarded scholarship per semester.
- 8. Funds will be paid by the Fort Bend 4-H Adult Leaders, Parents and Friends Treasurer upon receiving a copy of paid receipt showing proof of enrollment in at least 12 hours of college level course work.
  - a. Scholarship recipients will have two (2) years from the date awarded in which they may draw money from the scholarship fund. At the end of that time, all monies will revert back to the endowment fund. The only exception for this rule will be for 4-H'ers that go into the armed services for no more than six (6) years.
- 9. Rules and Regulations will be reviewed annually on or before May 31.
