ANNOUNCEMENT- FRESHWATER WETLANDS STUDENT INTERN

Texas Community Watershed Partners (a part of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, Texas A&M University) in Houston, TX is seeking applications for a paid Student Intern position for the spring 2021 semester, working 20 hours per week. The work includes freshwater wetland restoration and stormwater wetland projects at locations in the Houston-Galveston region. Responsibilities include adhering to COVID-19 protocols to work safely with staff and volunteers outdoors to collect, propagate, and plant wetland species during regularly scheduled workdays and volunteer planting events; maintaining wetland plant nurseries at various locations; organizing and maintaining volunteer gear and nursery tools and other duties as assigned to ensure successful completion of projects. Duties will also include driving a University vehicle with trailer, lifting up to 40 lbs, exposure to extremes of weather, and some Saturday hours. Cross-training on related projects, such as website updates and data reporting will occur within TCWP's Green Infrastructure for Texas program.

The Intern applicant must be a self-starter with a positive attitude and able to work independently in the field as well as collaboratively with volunteers and staff. Applicants **must** be enrolled in a college or university with a degree plan in Ecology, Biology, Natural Resource Science, or comparable field of study. Knowledge in wetland plant identification and plant propagation are preferred as well as field experience working in natural resources. Public speaking is required as well as good writing and editing skills. A clean driving record is required.
