4-H Tech Changemakers Overview and Intern Job Description

The 4-H Tech Changemakers (TCM) program uses a teens-as-teachers approach with teen leaders learning digital skills to teach them to adults. Through this process, the teens will become certified Tech Changemakers and work in partnership with their 4-H educator to use turnkey 'grab n' go' lesson plans to teach digital skills to adults in the community. The lesson plans will focus on digital skills that help drive economic opportunity.

In addition to harnessing their digital knowledge for teaching, youth will use their compelling voice and long-standing relationships within their communities to engage local stakeholders and policymakers to educate them on their projects and the importance of closing the digital divide.

Collectively over the next year, Tech Changemakers across the country will reach 40,000-50,000 rural adults with digital literacy skills enabling them to achieve greater economic opportunity. Furthermore, through the TCM program, 4-H teens will learn how to engage community stakeholders, teach digital skills classes, and work with underserved populations in their communities including Hispanic/Latino, Black/African American, and the Native American, and Alaskan Native communities.

Job Title: Intern - 4-H Tech Changemakers

Job Description: Assist the County Extension Agent (CEA) with administering the

requirements of the 4-H Tech Changemakers program in the county. Duties include recruiting, training, and facilitation of planning with teens (grades 9-12). Intern will identify adult target audiences and work with the CEA to deploy youth Tech Changemakers to deliver digital learning content. Intern must be comfortable teaching digital skills to adult audiences alongside youth leaders. Intern will attend trainings and meetings as

needed and will provide timely reports to the CEA.

Beginning Time Period: June 1, 2021

Ending Time Period: March 31, 2022

Time Commitment: Up to 15 hours per week

Pay Rate \$1,000 stipend per month (contract services)

Travel Required: Up to 120 miles per month (\$69 max)

Reimbursed monthly at a rate of \$0.575/mile

Intern will be required to complete a Professional/Contract Services Agreement form as well as submit a W9 to the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation.
