



This Summer, Harris County 4-H will be leading youth activities at the Steve Radack Community Center on Fridays from 1:00pm to 2:30pm!



WHO CAN JOIN?

Membership is open to all youth entering at least 9th grade regardless of socioeconomic level, race, color, sex, national origin or disability. Ambassadorship is a 12-month commitment, beginning June 2022 to May 2023.



WHEN IS TRAINING?

During the summer, ambassadors will attend one of the "Building Healthy Youth to Build a Healthy Texas"
Summits. These Summits will lay the foundation for ambassadors to implement health, wellness, nutrition, and safety programs across the state.



WHERE WILL YOU SERVE?

Once training is complete, youth ambassadors will provide 40 hours of service to their community. Hours can be earned through peer-to-peer education, school programs, community programs, and service learning opportunities.



WHAT IS IT ALL ABOUT?

This program is designed for high school age youth who have a passion for health and wellness. Youth will be trained at the local & regional level to become youth health experts who can motivate others to make changes in their lifestyle and improve overall health. More importantly, ambassadors will assist local county extension agents with program efforts, project activities, and much more!

WHY CHOOSE US?

Become a trained student assistant to Texas A&M AgriLife Extension agents, helping to provide leadership with programs.

Become knowledgeable and skilled in the healthy lifestyles subject matter.

Advocacy Academy

Advocacy Academy is the second phase of the Ambassador program. This program exposes 25 Ambassadors to the political process, agricultural law and lobbying, ethics of agricultural technology, agricultural policy, and communicating with consumers unfamiliar with agricultural production practices.

Poultry Ambassadors

This summer, 25 Poultry Ambassadors will be selected to attend a short course held at Texas A&M. The short course will introduce students to a rigorous college-level poultry science curriculum and educational experiences.

Domestic and International Experience

Ambassadors have the opportunity to apply to attend either a Domestic or International learning experience in alternating years. These trips allow Ambassadors to see first-hand the differences in challenges, characteristics and diverse atmospheres associated with agriculture abroad and even in our own country. In June 2018, selected Ambassadors visited Uruguay and Argentina. In August 2019 and August 2021. Ambassadors visited the West Coast and East Coast to increase awareness of immense challenges these states face, such as regulations and animal rights concerns.



The Texas 4-H Water Ambassadors
Program was formed in 2017 in an effort
to educate youth about water resources in
Texas. Every spring, up to 30 high school
youth are selected to participate in a
summer 4-H2O Leadership Academy
(tour). Students travel throughout Texas
to learn how water is collected,
conveyed, treated, conserved and
managed to meet the need of our
economy and citizenry.

To reinforce knowledge gained during the academy, water ambassadors pass on that information to others as they engage in various education and service activities throughout the year. This program also provides a platform for youth to connect with water industry professionals and educators who represent a wide range of water disciplines.
