THE 2023 TEXAS MAJORS ARE FAST APPROACHING!

PLEASE CHECK CATTLE (STEER AND HEIFER) AND SHEEP/GOAT TATTOOS!

Individual ID Tattoos (Breeding Animals)
County Number Tattoos (Market Animals)

All placing livestock that does not have a visible and/or legible tattoo will be **DISQUALIFIED at Texas major livestock shows.**

(DNA collection will not be considered for tattoo discrepancies or the absence of tattoos)

IF A TATTOO NEEDS TO BE REDONE, PLEASE DO SO BEFORE THE SHOW.
County-level state validation committees should be utilized to correct/replace tattoos.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY FORMS

Eligibility Forms (No Pass, No Play) are ultimately the member's responsibility to complete.

These forms are REQUIRED to be completed by every 4-H member participating in an event that requires 4-H membership.

- Forms are required regardless if school is missed or not.
Yes, if participation is on a Saturday or Sunday a form is required.
- Forms are to be signed by the parent and then sent to the school for eligibility approval prior to any 4-H member participating in any competitive 4-H activity.
- A separate form is required for each competitive event/activity.
- Multiple forms can be requested for all events that occur during the current school grading period.
- Forms can be picked up or mailed if time is permitted.
- Forms are required to be returned to the 4-H office prior to participation.

Should any special arrangements be needed, it must be communicated and approved with the 4-H office. This includes picking up &/or returning forms.

These forms come from the 4-H office. **They cannot be printed or emailed.**

Request your form and then make arrangements to pick it up. USPS mail is an option if time allows.

If you have special needs for any of the programs offered at the County or District level, please give us a 'least five days' notice.
We will make every reasonable effort to accommodate your needs.
