



## PARK RANGER



Involves public relations and security, enforcement of park and state laws and emergency assistance. Responsible for collection of fees, operating a vehicle, patrol of park property, report writing, dispensing information and some general maintenance duties. A ranger must have the ability to meet and communicate with park visitors and be able to work outdoors.

## PARK MAINTENANCE

Responsible for mowing and grounds maintenance, garbage and litter control, tree care, cleaning of facilities, vehicle maintenance and other maintenance needs as assigned. Position must be safety minded, maintain a good rapport with park visitors and be able to work outdoors.



## INTERPRETER/HISTORIAN



Responsible for interpretive activities. These activities include the development and delivery of various interpretive programs. In addition to amphitheater programs, other duties include: guided nature hikes; Eco-Explorer programming for children; maintaining organized and informative bulletin boards; and assisting staff with hosting special public events held within the park.

## PARK ATTENDANT

Involves working in the park's office and/or entrance station. Duties include greeting visitors, dispensing information, collecting fees, telephone and radio communications, some computer work, filing and verifying financial reports, operating cash register and other office duties as assigned.
