SUMMER STAFF OPPORTUNTIES

The summer of 2016 is right around the corner! The 4-H Conference Center provides an opportunity for you to work in an atmosphere where you will not only impact the lives of young people but also learn a lot about yourself and make life-long friends.

Requirements of Applicants

- Age 18 or older
- Successfully completed at least one year of college or other work by June 1, 2018
- Available from middle of May to middle of August (we will work around breaks and family time)
- Be enthusiastic, creative, hard-working, and dependable
- Be able to get along with others and work as a team

Internships and Summer Classes

We will work with any student to complete required tasks towards earning internship credit at their respective college or university.

Salary

Summer staff are employees of the Texas A&M University System and are paid bi-weekly. Staff are paid for required training. Room and board is provided along with staff shirts, CPR/First Aid certification, lifeguard certification, and other miscellaneous items. Exact salary depends on positions held.

AVAILABLE POSITIONS

Group Leader

- Act as a leader and chaperone for the youth assigned to their dorm
- Assist with teaching educational and recreational programs
- Act as a chaperone with groups of various ages as they move around camp
- Assist with putting on activities such as team challenges, dances, water games, and pool activities
- Work in kitchen, maintenance, or house-keeping as needed



Session Leader

- Teach educational sessions such as archery, rifle, kayaking, arts & crafts, dance, challenge course, swimming, or others as identified
- Act as a leader and chaperone for the youth assigned to their dorm
- Assist with putting on activities such as team challenges, dances, water games, and pool activities
- Work in kitchen, maintenance, or house-keeping as needed

Positions With Additional Training

The Texas 4-H Center will provide additional training for applicants in either of these positions. Challenge course training generally takes place during spring break, in March. Lifeguard training is conducted during staff training.

Lifeguard

- Guard during camps, open swim sessions, and weekend programming
- Monitor shallow water pool and/or lakefront facility for safety
- Assist in maintaining pool cleanliness when needed
- Participate in regular in-service trainings



Challenge Course Facilitator

- Facilitate team-building activities, low ropes, and high ropes
- Work with youth and outside groups for teambuilding programs
- Participate in regular in-service trainings
