



Learn to coordinate and present educational events that will encourage better health in your community. Give 40 hours of service to improve the health of your community.



- Be in high school or entering high school in the 2021/2022 academic year
- Be 14 years of age or older by August 31, 2021
- Be a current 4-H member, or be willing to join a local 4-H club if selected

June 27-July 1-Tier I 4-H2O Leadership Academy
