

2019 Cropping Season Underway

2019 has started off slowly for farmers. Many have been patiently waiting for dry weather. We have had some very wet conditions and many fields, as of this date, are still sitting and waiting to dry out so machinery can get them worked for planting. We still have some cotton fields that were never harvested and thus, are still standing with cotton bolls on them from last year. Some fields planted very early have corn emerging. Many farmers are switching from corn to cotton as those will be planted in early April. The wet conditions have been a challenge for ranchers also. Saturated fields have kept ranchers from grazing certain pastures and promoted more hay feeding while fields

try to dry out. Beef demand across the United States is strong and the long term forecast is for demand to remain strong. Generally, cattle remain in good condition. With this warming trend and plenty of moisture, pastures are set to flourish if/when we can get some extended days of sunshine. We have gone weeks without sunlight and plants are beckoning for wonderful sunlight to actively grow.

Long term weather forecast based on the Farmer's Almanac is for a warm, wet spring. We will see as God plans another year for us.
