



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNTIES

There are several opportunities coming up for both youth and adults as we kick off this summer!

4-H Program Development Committee (Youth and Adult)

Would you like to help steer the 4-H programming efforts in the future? Are you an out of the box thinker or want to help us engage youth and treach them the important life skills 4-H has to offer? This committee will help develop programs within Wise County 4-H and in the schools.

1 year commitment - 4 meetings total (2 virtual, 2 in person) June, August, January, April

4-H Family and Community Health Task Force (Youth and Adult)

This committee will focus on programs under the 4-H FCH umbrella, however not limited to contests. Input from the committee will help us develop workshops and trainings to teach life skills.

1 year commitment - 3 meetings total (1 in person, 2 virtual) June, August, January

4-H Livestock and Natural Resources Task Force (Youth and Adult)

This committee will focus on programs under the 4-H Ag/NR umbrella, however not limited to stock shows and raising livestock. Input from the committee will help us develop workshops and trainings focused on livestock, natural resources, and shooting sports.

1 year commitment - 3 meetings total (1 in person, 2 virtual) August, December, April

4-H Budget Committee (Adult and County Council Treasurer)

This committee will help develop the annual budget for the Wise County 4-H program, help identify donors and fundraising opportunities.

1 year commitment - 2 meetings total (2 in person) August, February

VIRTUAL ONLINE PROGRAMS

As we look to the summer, we would like to promote the various 4-H projects and programs locally. 4-H members can record short videos describing their 4-H project, program or contest. Videos would need to be 1-5 minutes long.

VIRTUAL LEAD ACADEMY

The format of the 2020 Texas 4-H Virtual LEAD Academy will offer concurrent workshops over the course of two-days focused on these topic areas. Unlike the face-to-face event, this year's Virtual LEAD Academy will be offering workshops targeting Intermediate and Senior Age 4-H members along with Adults. Many of the sessions offered however will still be targeting High School Age Youth and noted on the session descriptions.

LEAD Academy is geared towards 4-H members who are currently in the 9th – 12th grades (as of the current 4-H year). Youth will have an opportunity to learn about college opportunities and what it takes to get there, serve their community, and gain valuable life skills in a true college setting. Our goal of this activity will be to provide the opportunity for young people to connect, learn, engage, lead and impact their communities, their country and their world. The event will be designed to engage youth in hands-on educational activities in which they explore, practice and master existing and newly developed skills/knowledge in civic engagement, civic education and personal development. The objective is to provide youth a broad-based learning experience in which they will acquire practical knowledge and skills to reinforce the attitudes and motivation that will give them a heightened sense of responsibility and capacity to connect as active members of their communities, nation and world. From this experience, we hope the youth attending will apply what was learned in their real world experiences in which they develop leadership skills using their voices, work, ideas and/or behavior to make a difference in their community, country and world.






