4-H ENROLLMENT

4-H Enrollment started <u>August 15th</u>! All enrollment is done via the NEW 4HOnline 2.0. You can access 4HOnline 2.0 by going to our 4-H website at https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in and clicking on the 4HOnline icon. If you had a family profile in the old 4-H Connect System, that log in information will be the same in the new 4HOline 2.0. The website link will not change either.

A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for correct fees to be charged.

To maintain the level of programming and opportunities in the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program, an annual participant fee is implemented for each 4-H member (excluding Clover Kids). The participant fee is \$25 if enrolled from August 15th to October 31st, November 1st the participant fee will increase to \$30. Please do not worry if you are still pending at the county level once you have enrolled. The county office will try to keep up as best as we can by approving them at least once a week. As long as you complete your enrollment, you are in the system and good for enrollment and WCYF requirements. Enrollment dues must be paid by an electronic payment.

4-H Age / Grade Requirements

Texas 4-H membership eligibility will be based on SCHOOL GRADE and not age. The eligibility rules and guidelines are:

Youth may participate in 4-H year from September 1st of grade three through August 31st following completion of grade twelve, with these age restrictions:

Minimum age -8 (as of August 31, 2020 and in the 3rd grade) Maximum age -18 (as of August 31, 2020)

4-H Member Categories

Juniors: Grades 3, 4, and 5 Intermediates: Grades 6, 7, and 8 Seniors: Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12

FOOD PROJECT

If you want to be a star in the kitchen, try the food & nutrition project! You'll learn kitchen and cooking safety, how to prepare nutritious meals and snacks, and meal ideas to reduce your risk of disease. Learning experiences focus on nutrition, food purchasing, food preparation, food safety, and related careers. Here in District 3, the food and nutrition project kicks off with a start at the beginning of the 4-H year.

In leu of an in person workshop, we will have lunch time trainings on Oct. 1, Oct. 5 and Oct. 7th. We will stream these on Facebook as well as record and share the links. Look for more information via email.

Food Show

At the Food Show, youth choose a recipe from the contest categories and then prepare and present it to a panel of judges. During your interview with the judges, you will show how you prepared it, the nutrients and ingredients, personal dietary needs, healthy substitutions, and a cost analysis. This years theme is "Grocery Games".

FCH Quiz Bowl

A "Quiz Bowl" is a quiz game that tests teams of 4 on their knowledge of basic nutrition, consumer information, food and kitchen safety, food preparation skills and storage, and health. Up against the clock, the 4-Hers buzz in to answer a question and earn points for correct answers. Teams advance in a tournament-system bracket to win the competition.

Food Challenge

At the Food Challenge, teams of 3-4 students receive a list of ingredients and have 40 minutes to create a dish. The teams then present their dish to judges are scored on preparation, serving size, food safety concerns, nutritional value and cost.

Ag Product Identification

During the Ag Product ID Contest, youth will see 20 Texas agricultural products exhibited at different stations. Contestants must identify the commodity and answer a qeneral based on general industry knowledge about the product or specific to the individual product on display. Contestants are given 30-60 seconds to answer the questions.

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Quality Counts

Fall livestock show entries are in full swing and so is Quality Counts!

Thankfully, there are no big changes for the course and exam this year. As a reminder, exhibitors must be verified once per grade level division (Junior - 3-5 grade; Intermediate - 6-8 grade; Senior 9-12 grade), not each year. Exhibitors must have a verified number for major livestock show entries.

QUALITY COUNTS ENROLLMENT

Before getting started: For the best experience in the Quality Counts course, please use Mozilla Firefox as your internet source (Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, and Safari may work in some instances but are NOT suggested). Also, please make sure your browser (Firefox) has JavaScript and Cookies enabled. For desktop computers, you must have Adobe Flash Player 10.1 or greater installed.

We recommend using Firefox as your browser!



- 1. Go to: https://www.texaslivestockvalidation.com/qc/qcregister.aspx
- 2. Register with your information
 - a. It is very important to choose BOTH your 4-H and FFA chapter regardless of which you think you will show through!
 - b. You will need to enter your DOB and Phone Number in the format provided.
 - c. For grade level, please enter the grade you are entering (if between May-August) or your current grade, depending on the time of year you are registering in Quality Counts.
- 3. Click Submit Registration
- 4. This will trigger an email from dottie.goebel@ag.tamu.edu to keep for your records.
 - a. Do not delete this email as it contains a Return Link that you will NEED to come back to the course at any time.
- 5. Staying on the website, click Proceed to Curriculum.
- You will be directed to the Quality Counts curriculum website.
- 7. The course is free, so click the green Enroll Now button.
 - a. You may have to scroll down to see this if using a mobile device.
 - b. Though you do have to create another login on a separate website, this is necessary to be able to leave and come back to the curriculum as many
- 8. Click Register under "Are You a New Learner?" Even if you created an account last year and are enrolling in a new grade category, you need to create a new account. This is because we transitioned websites for improvements.
- 9. Create username and password and complete login details. The address entered is not used or saved and is only for this site.
- 10. Accept the terms and conditions and click Register.
- 11. Click "Click Here" under Course Access Details.
- 12. Click Quality Counts
- 13. Select Age Bracket according to your school grade as of August 31 of the current year.
- 14. Begin Course! The course will take approximately 2 hours to complete
- 15. You may leave and come back to the course using the Return Link (Step 4a).
- 16. Once you complete the course, you will click Proceed to Test
- 17. You must complete the exam once you start it, but you can take it as many times as needed to achieve an 80% or higher.
- 18. Once passed, your verified Quality Counts number is ready for livestock show



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNTIES

There are several opportunities coming up for both youth and adults as we kick off this fall

4-H Program Development Committee (Youth and Adult)

Would you like to help steer the 4-H programming efforts in the future? Are you an out of the box thinker or want to help us engage youth and treach them the important life skills 4-H has to offer? This committee will help develop programs within Wise County 4-H and in the schools.

1 year commitment - 4 meetings total (2 virtual, 2 in person) October, January, April, August

4-H Family and Community Health Task Force (Youth and Adult)

This committee will focus on programs under the 4-H FCH umbrella, however not limited to contests. Input from the committee will help us develop workshops and trainings to teach life skills.

1 year commitment - 3 meetings total (1 in person, 2 virtual) October, January, May

4-H Livestock and Natural Resources Task Force (Youth and Adult)

This committee will focus on programs under the 4-H Ag/NR umbrella, however not limited to stock shows and raising livestock. Input from the committee will help us develop workshops and trainings focused on livestock, natural resources, and shooting sports.

1 year commitment - 3 meetings total (1 in person, 2 virtual) September, January, May

4-H Budget Committee (Adult and County Council Treasurer)

This committee will help develop the annual budget for the Wise County 4-H program, help identify donors and fundraising opportunities.

1 year commitment - 2 meetings total (2 in person) October, May

**Type of meeting subject to change due to restrictions or how committee sees fit.



4-H in 2020 looks a little different. Our goal is to do club meetings, trainings and contests in person. To do this, we as a whole will need to follow COVID-19 guidelines set by Texas A&M AgriLife, Texas 4-H, Wise County Judge and Emergency Management Coordinator.

Group meetings of 10 or FEWER people can be conducted as long as they meeting our current COVID guidelines. For all indoor and outdoor events, mask will need to be worn by everyone over the age of ten UNLESS you can social distance 6 ft apart.

All other programs must get approval from the appropriate County Extension Agent. If approved, certain paperwork must be completed 2 weeks in advance.
