



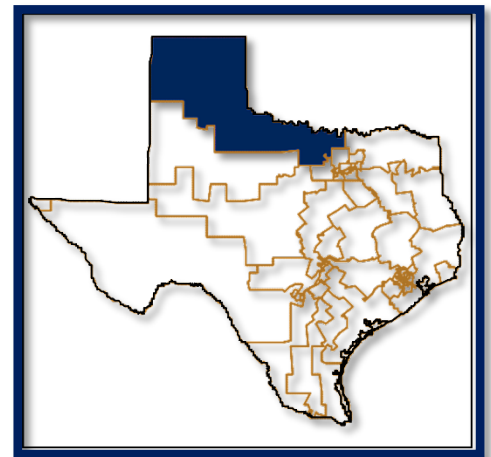

Parts of Floyd and Wise counties are also included in the district.
